**TONY COLLINS & YMCA OF CENTRAL OHIO HONORED  
WITH COMMUNITY SHELTER BOARD'S  
2021 NANCY JEFFREY ADVOCATE AWARD**

(Columbus, OH) – Tony Collins and YMCA of Central Ohio were recognized with the 2021 Nancy Jeffrey Advocate Award. Given by Community Shelter Board, the award honors exemplary work among its partner agencies, in honor of Nancy Jeffrey's legacy as one of its founders.

When the global pandemic began, Collins and the YMCA brought three new facilities on-line to assure social distancing in all shelters across the community. This was a herculean effort that was critical to keep the COVID-19 virus from spreading like wildfire in homeless shelters. This effort also included adding more beds in these new facilities to assure that that anyone who needed shelter was able to have immediate access. The YMCA joined with Community Shelter Board in making this public health commitment to assure that no one was left on the streets without shelter and access to hand washing, masks, and medical care.

To safely care for those who are homeless and COVID positive or exposed to COVID, the YMCA worked with Community Shelter Board to open an isolation and quarantine shelter, complete with medical personnel. This shelter allows people who are COVID-positive or symptomatic and presumed positive to safely isolate while they recover. It's a safe space for people who would be home resting on the couch if they had a home.

A breakfast reception was held today at the Boathouse at Confluence Park, where a series of Community Shelter Board's Founder Awards were presented by NBC4.

As President and CEO of the YMCA of Central Ohio, Collins works with a team of committed professionals to strengthen the spirit, mind, and body of our neighbors in Franklin, Delaware, Logan, and Pickaway
